The school in which everyone is a teacher and learner starts this Summer in the village of Lumsden in Scotland, home of the <u>Scottish Sculpture Workshop</u>, Pushkino in Russia, Zburazh in Belarus and Nagykamarás in Hungary. We are also preparing field-trips and classrooms in Germany, Italy and The Netherlands, where the Van Abbe Museum and Dutch farmers are opening their institution and their land to what can be learned from each other.

Myvillages' ongoing International Village Shop is currently part of was sein wird / what will be at Kunsthaus Graz.




Antje, Kathrin and Wapke elsewhere
